
# A comparison of children's well-being at school in 18 countries

### The Children's Worlds survey

- A large-scale international study of children's lives and well-being
- Initiated in 2009
- Fills a major evidence gap
- Wave 2 of the study (2013 to 2016) funded by the Jacobs Foundation
- Over 61,000 children aged 8 to 12 in a diverse range of 18 countries across four continents
- Wave 3 (2017-2019) has just started over 40 countries participating



#### **Agreement questions**


- I like going to school






#### Gender and satisfaction with teachers




### 'I like going to school' - % totally agree











#### CHILDREN'S WORLDS

Children's Worlds, the International Survey of Children's Well-Being (ISCWeB), is a worldwide research survey on children's subjective well-being. The study aims to collect solid and representative data on children's lives and daily activities, their time use and in particular on their own perceptions and evaluations of their well-being. The purpose is to improve children's well-being by creating awareness among children, their parents and their communities, but also among opinion leaders, decision makers, professionals and the general public.
